DIRECTIONS FROM U.S. ROUTE 1

Southbound

Proceed past the exits for Ryders Lane; you will then see the large "Rutgers GH Cook Campus" sign on the right-hand side. Take the next exit for College Farm Rd/Squibb Rd and make first right at the yield sign. Continue along College Farm and turn right at the 4-way stop onto Dudley Road. Continue along Dudley Road and turn right onto Biel Road. The Cook Campus Center will be the first building on the left. Turn left at stop sign and park in Lot 99C or 99D.

Northbound
