DIRECTIONS FROM U.S. ROUTE 1

Southbound

Proceed past the exits for Ryders Lane; you will then see the large Rutgers GH Cook Campus sign on the right-hand side. Take the next exit for College Farm Rd/Squibb Rd and make first right at the yield sign. Continue along College Farm and turn right at the 4-way stop onto Dudley Road. Continue along Dudley Road and turn right onto Biel Road after a wooden bus stop. The Cook Campus Center will be the first building on the left. **Park in Lot 99C and 99D.**

Northbound
