**2. Large Ruminant – Classrooms-** *Animal Identification Skillathon-* **Dr Mike Westendorf,** RCE Livestock Specialist. Learn about the basics of animal identification methods both old and new.

**3. Small Ruminants – Round House- Got Issues with Your Kids (or lambs?), Dr. Christina Wilson,** Equiheart Veterinary Services. Dr. Wilson will discuss strategies for helping newborn kids and lambs that are rejected, orphaned, small, weak, chilled, not nursing, etc.

**1. Equine-Red Barn (stall side)-** *Modifying Horse Behavior using Tricks!* - Dr. Sara Malone, Rutgers Animal Science Instructor - Learn how to work with your horse to overcome common behavioral problems and how to train your horse to perform simple tricks.

2. All animals –Classrooms- *Diseases That Animals and Humans Share*: Laura Eppinger, County 4-H Agent, Rutgers Cooperative Extension. This is an interactive matching game. Participants will gain an understanding of zoonotic diseases and how to prevent them, the ways diseases can pass from animals to people, and careers in this field (such as a state veterinarian and an epidemiologist.)

Learn sound biosecurity practices that will help protect you and your animals from the introduction and spread of diseases on the farm and as you travel to fairs and shows.
